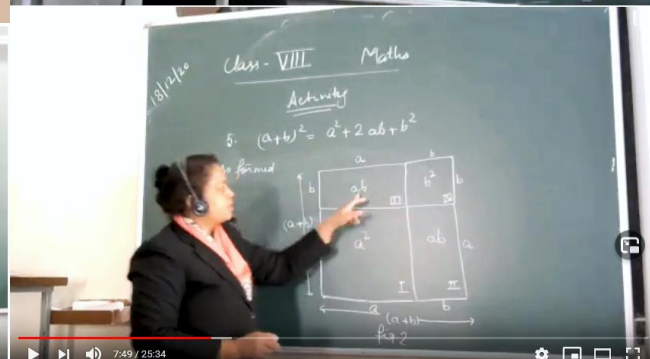


Independence Day Celebration - 2020-21
